
<u>**Taupo Branch Prize Shoot**</u> is being held on Saturday 7th November 2009, open to all NZDA members.

So, having feasted on fresh back steaks and heart for breakfast, Dave and myself loaded our packs with enough food and gear for two days hunting up Prospect Creek. Meanwhile Jerry packed up and headed back to the Worsley Hut having injured his foot during the first week of our adventure. Dave and I followed a well worn deer track on the true right of Prospect Creek until we reached the stunningly beautiful Lake Brownlee. After wading around the

edge to the head of the lake we continued up the stream bed through dense ribbonwood and boulders toward Lake Sumor, which was apparently named so in homage to the hungry man in

W.G. Grave's party who always wanted some more! We sat and watched a Wapiti x Red hind for a few minutes before carrying on toward the head basin. Just before we reached our destination we inadvertently spooked a Red stag and another hind. As a consequence of having read in Moir's guide book that there is an excellent rock bivvy located in the area, we had decided not to bring a tent with us for this leg of the trip. We must of spent more than an hour or so looking for that darn bivvy before we finally gave up and

resolved to the fact that we were bound to spend the night out under the stars. Of course the next day we got away early and had decided to head back down to the Worsley River, we hadn't had much luck by this stage and that was not about to change either! A day later, on our travels back down the Worsley, as we were nearing the Castle Creek confluence, Dave spotted


a good 12 point Red stag just standing there in the middle of the bloody river!
